

Title 23: Highways

PART 450—PLANNING ASSISTANCE AND STANDARDS
Subpart C—Metropolitan Transportation Planning and Programming

§450.334 Annual listing of obligated projects.

(a) In metropolitan planning areas, on an annual basis, no later than 90 calendar days following the end of the program year, the State, public transportation operator(s), and the MPO shall cooperatively develop a listing of projects (including investments in pedestrian walkways and bicycle transportation facilities) for which funds under 23 U.S.C. or 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53 were obligated in the preceding program year.

(b) The listing shall be prepared in accordance with §450.314(a) and shall include all federally funded projects authorized or revised to increase obligations in the preceding program year, and shall at a minimum include the TIP information under §450.326(g)(1) and (4) and identify, for each project, the amount of Federal funds requested in the TIP, the Federal funding that was obligated during the preceding year, and the Federal funding remaining and available for subsequent years.

(c) The listing shall be published or otherwise made available in accordance with the MPO's public participation criteria for the TIP.

MPO Name Determination - Olivia



Pre-Process BUGST-16A Data **On-System Control** Section Spatial File GIS test FULL Data from TxC SSA **ESTIP MPO** Information **DCIS** Data Manual Input

- The MPO determination process is based on "CSJ" or "Control Section" instead of federal recipient project number
- No single file contains geographic information for all CSJ.
- MPO information for most CSJ (~95%) could be found in on-system control section spatial file.

Pre-Process BUGST-16A data

- Split up data for unique CSJ
- Obtain CS for each CSJ

On-System CS to determine MPO

- Assign MPOs based on the On-System CS spatial file containing the spatial relationship between on-system control section and MPOs
- Over 95% CSJ have been assigned MPO

GIS Test Full Data (from TxC SSA)

- Map the begin and end points of each CSJ based on the lat/long in the file
- Determine the MPO for each CSJ based on lat/long

MPO Name Determination - Olivia

ESTIP MPO information

 Use ESTIP MPO info to determine MPO for remaining CSJ

DCIS CSJ county information

Determine the MPO for each county.

If over 50% of county areas are located within MPOs, the county is determined to locate within MPOs

 Identify MPO for remaining CSJ

Manual input

- Check TxC website
 and manually look up
 CSJs in the location
 section and STIP
 section
- Check if have a MPO
 Name and what the
 Population is to verify
 if Rural or not



Guidance

HWY/Bike & Ped Projects

- There may be some CSJs that are outside your MPO area, however, at least one CSJ listed will be within your MPO Boundary
- If there are multiple MPOs within the federal project number, each MPO will show all of the CSJs associated with the federal project number

Grouped Projects


- There may be some CSJs that are outside your MPO area, however, at least one CSJ listed will be within your MPO Boundary
- If there are multiple MPOs within the federal project number, <u>each MPO</u> will show the first CSJ associated with the federal project number
- If there are multiple CSJs within a federal project number, only the first CSJ will be reported

ACCESS Reporting



Instructions

- Select MPO from the drop down list
- Select the Project Type
 - Highway, Grouped or Bike/Ped
- Click on "Load"
- The report will appear if there is data for that MPO and/or Project Type
- Export report as PDF file
